Volunteer for VOAM

Our volunteers save the Community in two direct ways. First we avoid the need to have contractors perform minor maintenance activities by doing them ourselves. We cannot get a contractor on site for less than \$100, plus the cost of the work being performed can be several hundred dollars. We typically handle about 20 to 30 Service Requests a year that we can perform locally. We receive about 50 to 75 Service Requests a year. All require a local investigation to determine the cause and define the appropriate course of action to remedy the Issue. Second, we negotiate the price for the work being performed.

Committees avoid Management Co. employees who would otherwise perform required tasks. The **per hour** rates are as follows from our original contract (may be higher now):

Community Associations Manager \$150
Community Manager/Office Manager \$100
Office Staff \$50

We renegotiated the Management Co. contract and currently pay around \$1,415 per month directly attributed to the offset our Committees provide. **Their standard rate is about double that**. Needless to say, the Committees have kept the Maintenance Fees at a much lower level.

Finally, a desperate plea from all the committees plus the Board. Volunteerism has never been lower in the sixteen years of VOAM's existence. If the work that is currently performed by volunteers is turned over to our management company, CMA, we lose much of the control we have over our own affairs, plus as above you can see the cost of CMA performing the work which would drastically increase our management costs,. If this plea causes even a few residents to consider volunteering in some capacity, the additional space taken in this month's article will have been well worth it!!!

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2023 Asphalt Activity – Driveway Replacements & Repairs – UPDATE: This activity is now scheduled to begin on September 14. Specific instructions will be emailed to affected residents. All residents should use caution when proceeding through the Community, since there will be resident vehicles and paving equipment parked on the street during the driveway work. Tarbuck will be repairing the entrance this year which will require one-lane traffic in and out of our Community. Please be patient if you are asked to wait and be extra careful returning to the Community. Incoming traffic will be given the right-of-way, but there may be an outgoing vehicle waiting to exit. The entry work should be completed in 2 days and is scheduled to begin first.

Sidewalk Crack Repair & Overlay Project – Determine coating material and plan to overlay cracked stoops. We planned to offer residents with cracked stoops an opportunity to have this unsightly condition corrected at your expense, on a voluntary basis. We have had numerous requests for a solution to this cracking. The Overlay product has been investigated and tested. The interested residents have been identified. The contractor for applying the material has yet to be determined. The original contractor has been unable to schedule a site meeting. We are now waiting for an alternate contractor to be available for a site meeting.

2023 Building Inspections - This is the second year of our triannual building inspection process. This year we inspected Buildings 20 through 33 (40 units). Inspections have now been completed. The Board recently approved \$2,125 for the first installment of painting and \$8,465 for the balance of the painting. Ron Belensky, our resident professional painter has completed the first installment and is now working on the balance. All roof items from the inspections have been completed by Bronson Roofing. All vinyl siding cleaning items have been completed by Premier Power Cleaning. Quite a few residents had Premier clean the balance of their unit while here performing the Association's work, and several have scheduled them back for additional work.

Service Request Process – information for our new residents and a reminder for some. We encourage all of you to use the CMA Website Owner Portal to submit Service Requests. The process is a simple one able to be accessed from your smart phone or computer. https://cmamgt.com/ Click on Owner Portal. This will get you to the login process. If you have not set up your Portal yet, then follow the instructions on the web site. Once logged in you will be at your Dashboard. Click on: Submit a new request. Select: General Request. Select: Choose a type of request. Click on Service Request. Fill in the Subject box and the Detailed Description box. Click on submit. Your Service Request is now in the System. It will come to the Buildings & Roads Committee with authorization to correct the Issue and engage a contractor, if needed.

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Grounds Committee

Autumn's cooler weather is approaching as we focus on the beautiful transition of color in our trees and shrubs. We have scheduled a Fall Walk Around within the next two weeks to determine any trees or shrubs that need replaced.

The brutal thirteen weeks of hot dry weather have placed stress on all trees and shrubs as well as our lawns. Please continue to water your new spring shrubs that were planted – twice a week – into September.

This month, the rejuvenation of four of the worst lawns will be completed by TruGreen under contract by MM&M. This will include adding soil where needed, overseeding, fertilizing and aeration. The soil gets compacted from the heavy lawn equipment and over time needs aeration.

Our Arborist, Walter Jarosh, has evaluated our trees at an on-site meeting, especially targeting the pin oaks which now need treatment. He will be giving us a quote for their special treatment with added fertilizer and afterwards we will schedule that to be done.

Pond 3 requires dredging of the build-up of sludge on the bottom. The Grounds Committee is researching alternate dump sites, excavators who can reach the pond and exploring any permits or testing that may be required.

Due to our mild winter, the insects have been a nuisance on trees and shrubs. To date, we have not seen any lanternflies. Aphids, tree insects, ground bees and a hornet nest have all required attention.

The community zinnia flowers have done well in the soil amended beds, so we plan to expand our efforts next spring. These need to be watered several times a week and we extend our invitation to volunteers who can help.

Your suggestions are always welcomed, and we look forward to hearing from you. Help to keep our beautiful landscape vibrant!
